




The Avengers are down. Kang has set something in motion here in the present, and he is about to jump into the future and reap the benefits. I have one shot at this...

We reach the end of the time portal and my stomach lurches. Kang siezes the moment and gets in one lucky shot. My world starts spinning.




My space armor normally has some basic propulsion capabilities, but Kang's blast disabled everything.

I manage to get my shield up just in time. It absorbs most of the impact, and my space armor takes care of the rest. I'll have to thank Tony later for that one.




Where is Kang? He should have landed near me, but there's no sign of him. The only thing I can see is a large black building in the distance. Everything else is desert.


This seems to be some kind of research center, but everything is deathly quiet. I can't see much from the vent openings. I drop down to take a closer look.




A security drone finds me almost immediately, warning me to stand down in a dull metallic voice. Doesn't look like Stark tech.



I try asking the drone a few questions about this base. It answers me with a laser blast.




The stealthy approach was never really my style anyways.




Two more drones join the fight. Their blasts hit the generator behind me. This can't be good...




Seconds later, the generator explodes. The roar is deafening. Once again, my training kicks in and I get my shield behind me just in time.

I think that was the last of them. I take a closer look at the drones. This is old Justin Hammer tech. Very old. I thought Kang jumped into the future, but is this actually the past?




I hear the sound of metal boots approaching, and I assume it's another drone. I never expected it to be Ultron.

They head towards his last known location, and after reading a few minds, Emma is able to track him down. They find Sinister working on his latest test subjects - dozens of screaming Moloids in separate containers.



In a different time and place, a battle might have started. But this world is dying, and uneasy alliances are necessary to save it. Sinister agrees to release his prisoners, share his research, and generally behave himself. Emma helps the Moloids get back to their tunnels, then starts on a mission of her own. Two hours later, I receive a short message from Beast: WE NEED GROOT.



Groot is one of the "off world" Avengers who is helping to set up a human colony on a space station given to Earth by the Shi'ar. There is no way we can get Groot back here before time runs out. Dr. Strange tells me to leave it to him, and begins glowing bright red. A horrible wailing noise fills the room, like a thousand animals being slaughtered. Strange suddenly vanishes in a bright flash of light, and something smells like blood. I don't like this one bit.



I don't know how Dr. Strange was able to travel over 300 miles through outer space in a matter of seconds, but I do know that he arrived in the middle of a Brood attack. Groot and a team of human soldiers were trying to hold them off, but were heavily outnumbered.


Strange drops Groot off at Sinister's lab, then excuses himself to "replenish his crimson energy". I don't even want to know what that involves.

Once inside, Tony will access Doom's central command core, and will assign the Doombots to follow his orders. Ultron leading Doombots against Kang - this made Tony laugh. He will meet us at the rendezvous point in New York City.



The symbiote filled him with rage and bloodlust, leaving him more of a broken man than he ever was before.



Emma will use her telepathic abilities to keep the symbiote under control, allowing Flash Thompson to be the hero that he used to be. I wish we could separate him from the creature, but he isn't ready for that yet. One battle at a time.



Tony and I meet on the rooftop at the rendezvous point while we wait for the others to arrive. He tells me how the city always reminds him of Pepper. She also died in the fight against Thanos, like so many other heroes and loved ones. Tony admits that he was glad when Strange boiled Thanos alive, and that he hopes the same fate befalls Kang.
